*Reservation Policies and Procedures*



In fairness to all Newcomers, and to show common courtesy to the people who take our calls for reservations, we ask you to comply with the following procedures:

1. Re-read the Newsletter for details prior to making your call.
2. Note and adhere to the starting day and time that reservations will be accepted, as this varies with month and activity.
3. When calling, speak clearly.
4. Spell your last name.
5. Say your phone number clearly, and then repeat it.
6. If menu selections are required, indicate each person's choice for each course offered when you mail in your check, payable to SB Newcomers Club.
7. Mail your check the same day as you receive confirmation of your reservation.
8. The Club policy is "No Show / No Refund!" unless otherwise stated.
9. Please check individual events for special cancellation policies.
10. A couple may make a reservation for themselves and one other couple or single person for an event. A single person may make his/her reservation and one other person.
11. If you have signed up for an activity and cannot attend, please call and let the activity planners know, so someone else will be able to attend.
12. It is permissible to have a non-member call to make a reservation for a member. The only information a member gives to a non-member caller is the phone number to call, name of the event, and for whom they are calling.
13. If a member is activated from a wait list, the member is responsible for calling any other social for which they are wait-listed, either to remove their name or have their name dropped to the bottom of the wait list.

## Local Heritage

### Lunch at the historic Little Town Club

**When:** Wednesday, Feb 20, 11.45-1.30pm.

**Description:** In 1915, the all-women Little Town Club needed new quarters for its members, many of whom lived in Montecito. They purchased a lot at 27 Carrillo Street with a one-story Italianate Cottage dating to about 1885 where they could continue to meet informally for lunch or to rest and visit with each other while shopping in town. By 1923, the clubhouse became inadequate and the club engaged the masterful architect George Washington Smith to redesign the existing building. He transformed the "little white cottage" into a stucco building and artistic charming club house. Today, after more than 90 years, the club still serves its original purpose. Eighteen lucky, female Newcomers will have the opportunity to experience lunch at this historic club, made possible by Newcomer Dana Machalleck who generously arranged the visit. Lunch will include soup, a chicken entrée, dessert, a glass of wine, and coffee or ice tea. We meet at 11.45am outside the club, then socialize until 12.15 when lunch will be served in the dining room. There is a Dress Code: no denim, sweat suits or other casual wear.

For Socials, you are requested to bring a platter of your favorite or most requested hors d'oeuvres to generously serve 10 to 12 people. (No dips please, in order to save the hosts' carpets.) The committee provides desserts.

Please bring a dish that you would be proud to serve in your own home. Dishes should be finger food only and table-ready with serving dish and utensil(s).

At Lifestyle events, all food and beverages are provided by the committee along with a gift for the host. This is reflected in the cost.

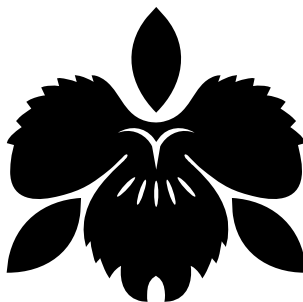

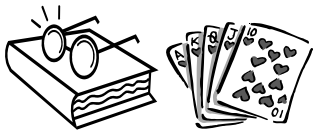

It is important that these FARs and checks be submitted quickly, so that members' personal accounts can be reconciled and checks will not become obsolete. Activities are expected to approximately break even.

Please observe the following guidelines:

**Members paying for events:**

- If you sign up for an event and pay your fee, you cannot expect to cancel and receive a refund unless there is someone on a waiting list to take your place, especially if the host/vendor has been prepaid. Cancellation and refund policies vary by event and should be included in the event article. If not, ask the event contact.
- Do not place a "stop payment" on any check, as this results in Club account reconciliation problems and becomes a financial burden on all members.

**Committee members:**

- Submit the FAR with receipts and checks (no cash in the mail, please) within two weeks of the event or by the end of the month of the activity, whichever allows more time. Expense reimbursement will also occur within 14 days.
- Be specific about cancellation and refund policies in your Activity article.

To the majority of Activity members who process and submit checks and reimbursement requests in a timely manner, I offer my thanks. You serve the Club and its members well and make my job easier.

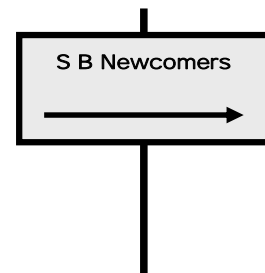

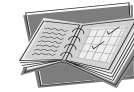
